The Personality of God

I. Introduction

Definition—Webster, 1828

PERSONAL'ITY, n. That which constitutes an individual a distinct person, or that which constitutes individuality.

The personality of an intelligent being extends itself beyond present existence to what is past, only by consciousness--

1. Direct application or applicability to a person; as the personality of a remark.

Is God a person like us?

No, we are a person like Him, being created in His image. Of course, that image has become deeply marred by sin!

II. The Relative Natures of God and Man.

- 1. God is a pure, underived, self-conscience, self-determining, self-dependent, self-manifesting, holy, living being, and is thus **PERSONAL**
- 2. Man has a derived, limited personal existence, being self-conscious, self-regulating, self-manifesting, and alive, in the image of God—but he has become unholy through his disbelief and disobedience (sin). No attempt should ever be made to place the personality of man on God; rather, man was made in the image of God. *Gen* 1:26, 27
- **3.** God is perfectly **self-conscious** or **self-aware**, declaring to Moses, "I am." *Exo* 3:13, 14
- 4. Through His active **self-expression** or **self-manifestation** God reveals His personality. As the scripture reveals the emotions of God, the names of God, and the glory of God, the **attributes** and **essential existence** of God are revealed.
- 5. Man was created to have **personal fellowship** with God and a godly personality. The corruption of man's person and personality caused a breach in the personal fellowship between God and man. The holy God cannot enjoy fellowship with an unholy man. The man must be reconciled back into the fellowship of God (God did not change, will not change, and cannot change). The man must be born again, made anew, in the likeness of the last Adam. That new soul is made holy, kept holy by the Holy spirit, but to enjoy the sweetness of a personal relationship with God, man has to be completely changed. Man's corrupted **intellect**, **will** and **emotions** can find correction and stability in the intellect, will, and emotions of the holy God.

6. An Important Fact Regarding Converted Man:

Redemption does not merely restore a sinner to the image of the first Adam but to the full image of the last Adam, Jesus Christ who is the **express image of God**.

IV. The Emotions of God.

Definition—Webster, 1828

EMO'TION, n. [L. emotio; emoveo, to move from.]

- 1. Literally, a moving of the mind or soul; hence, any agitation of mind or excitement of sensibility.
- 2. In a philosophical sense, an internal motion or agitation of the mind which passes away without desire; when desire follows, the motion or agitation is called a passion.
- 3. Passion is the sensible effect, the feeling to which the mind is subjected, when an object of importance suddenly and imperiously demands its attention. The state of absolute passiveness, in consequence of any sudden percussion of mind, is of short duration. The strong impression, or vivid sensation, immediately produces a reaction correspondent to its nature, either to appropriate and enjoy, or avoid and repel the exciting cause. This reaction is very properly distinguished by the term emotion.

Emotions therefore, according to the genuine signification of the word, are principally and primarily applicable to the sensible changes and visible effects, which particular passions produce on the frame, in consequence of this reaction, or particular agitation of mind.
