# CROSSING THE RED SEA Egyptians, Moses, & Israel

#### Introduction

- 1. The crossing of the Red Sea was a miraculous event.
- 2. There are lots of types and shadows and similar things to compare.

#### I. THE EGYPTIANS

- 1. They were like most of the world today dead in trespass and sin.
- 2. The Heavens declared the glory of God then as now Ps 19:1-3, but they made themselves Gods with their own hands; the Gods of today's world are triune, pleasure, fortune and fame.
- 3. They saw the great power of God in the plagues of blood, frogs, lice, flies, murrain, boils, hail, locust, darkness and the death of the first born.
- 4. Paul's words in Rom1:18-25 fit them perfectly.
- 5. God hardened Pharaoh's heart, probably by doing no more than holding up the free labor before him. Ex 14:5
- 6. The solders were probably no different from Pharaoh desiring to feather their nest and have praise of Pharaoh and their people.
- 7. God destroyed Pharaoh and his army drowning them in the Red Sea, I have no doubt they went from water to eternal fire. Ps 9:17

#### II. Moses

- 1. Unlike the Egyptians. Heb 11:24-29
- 2. He was in some ways similar to Christ.
  - A. He was a prophet appointed by God Deut 18:15-16, Acts 3:19-26 and Acts7:37
  - B. He was appointed a deliverer. Acts 7:35-36
- 3. He was just a man.
  - A. He got ahead of God and got into trouble. Acts 7:23-27
  - B. He made excuses Ex 3:11, Ex4:1, Ex4:10, Ex 4:13, Ex 5:22 and Ex 6:12
  - C. He disobeyed God in unbelief. Nu 20:1-12
- 4. He was just a man but some times his faith was 100%. Ps 23:4
  - A. His faith was full and complete when trapped at the Red Sea. Ex 14:13
  - B. His faith was full and complete when he led the children of Israel Into and across the sea.

### III. Israel

- 1. They were in bondage.
  - A. They were set free by the death of the first born.
- 2. The Passover.
  - A. The first born of Israel escaped death by the blood of the Passover Lamb.
  - B. Christ is our Passover. I Co 5:7

## 3. JN 8:31-36

- A. The truth shall make you free. JN 8:32
- B. We have never been in bondage. JN 8:33
- C. Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of it. JN 8:34
- D. The servant abideth not in the house forever JN 8:35 (They are sold Rom 7:14)
- E. The son abideth ever. JN 8:35 (Not a slave, he is free) Christ is free from sin.
- F. If the son sets you free you are free indeed. JN 8:36 The free son could buy and set an old slave free. Jesus redeemed us Gal 3:13
- 4. I Co 10:1-2 Baptized in the cloud and in the sea
  - A. Many have used this scripture trying to defend sprinkling, saying this was baptism but not immersion.
  - B. The fact is they were immersed, the sea was wall of water on each side and the cloud was over them.
  - C. Israel followed Moses into the sea separating themselves from Egypt and bondage.
  - D. We follow Christ into the water of baptism, by doing so we are identifying our selves with Christ portraying his burial and his resurrection; we also say we are dead to sin and raised to walk in newness of life
  - E. Similarities continued beyond the crossing, Paul points out That God was not pleased with many of them.
